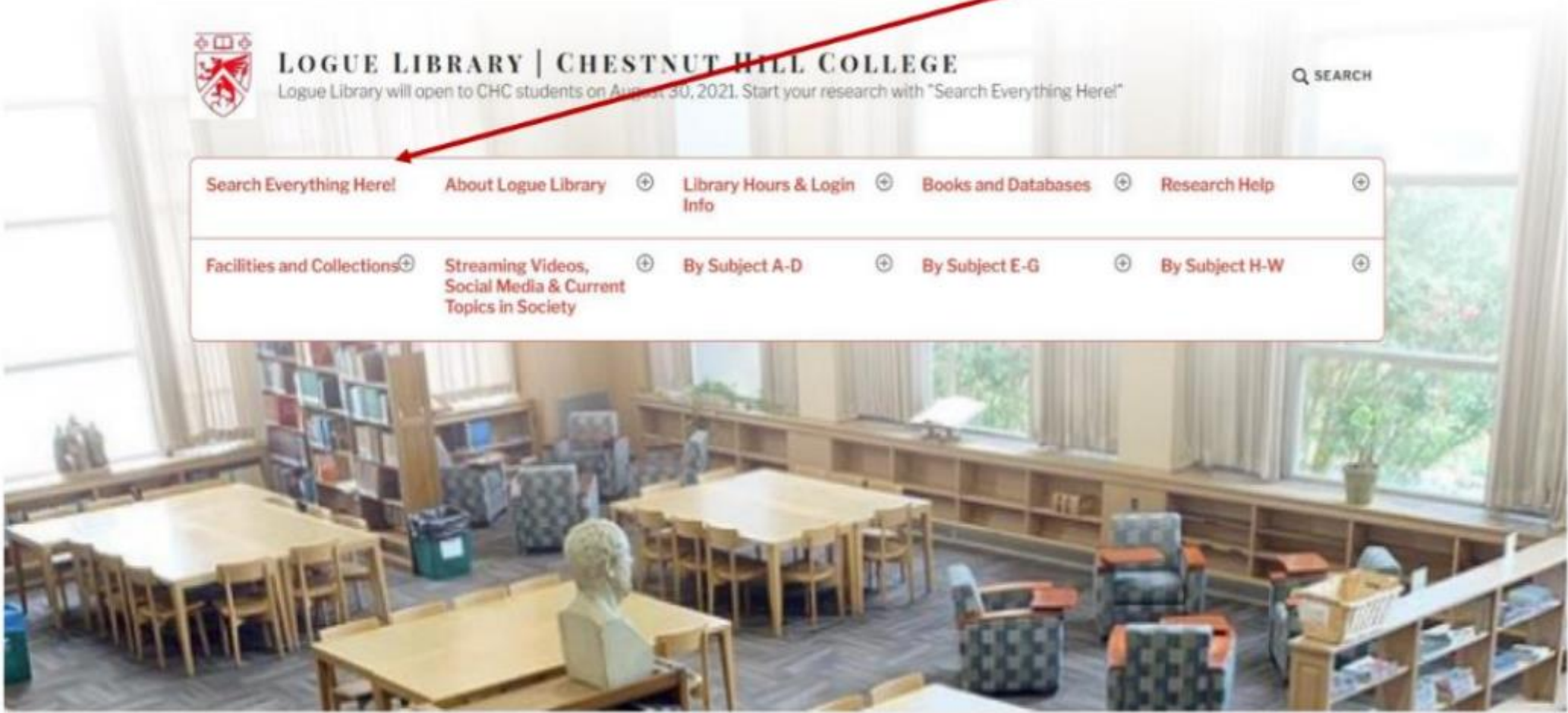

- (a) Publication "From..To" Date
- (b) Source Types (ex: Academic Journals)
- (c) "Peer Reviewed"

Step 4 : Below are the **"Refine Results,"** in the "Available in Library Collection," for **"USA election polls."** Usually, your data cannot be over 5 years old. So **change the Publication Date** from the default to 2017 to 2021. Once completed, **press your enter key** on your keyboard to set-up this option.
